



Information for Districts and Charter Schools that did participate in the Early Intervention Software Program (HB513) in 2012-13 and who used
Compass Learning software
Ticket to Reading (Voyager) software

During the 2012-2013 school year, you participated in the H.B. 513 program and used the software programs **Compass Learning** or **Ticket to Reading**. As a first-year participant, you have priority status to continue your participation this year for Kindergarten and first grade. S.B. 260, approved in the 2013 legislative session, expanded the program to grades K-3. Therefore, you have the opportunity to apply for licenses for grades 2-3 if you would like to expand your program.

However, **Compass Learning** or **Ticket to Reading** did not re-apply and renew their contract for 2013-2014 through the Request for Proposal process and was not approved as a vendor for this program this year. You have two options:

1. You may continue to use this software and negotiate your price directly with the company. The state program will not fund any part of the license.
2. You may choose another vendor from the list of approved vendors for the 2013-2014 year. The state program will fund your participation with one of these vendors:
 - *IStation* (Imagination Station)
 - *Imagine Learning* (Imagine Learning)
 - *Waterford Early Reading Program* (Waterford Research Institute)
 - *i-Ready Diagnostic & Instruction* (Curriculum Associates, Inc.)
 - *Success Maker Reading* (Pearson Education, Inc.)

Please note that the legislation only includes literacy programs in 2013-2014, not literacy and numeracy software. Schools participating in math software programs will also need to determine if they will continue funding those on their own.

Applications are due on June 28. Applications will be posted on the link above by the end of the day on Friday, June 14. It is an online application, and it will require the names and email addresses of all principals and teachers participating in the program. Each school may only request one software program; schools within a district may choose different programs.

An informational meeting with representatives from each company will be held on Wednesday, June 19 at the Utah State Office of Education, Basement West, from 8:30AM to 12:00PM. This meeting will also be available to view online at the same time at <http://connect.schools.utah.gov/ela> and the recording will be posted on the website above for later viewing.
