

**UTAH ATE SKILL CERTIFICATION  
PERFORMANCE EVALUATION  
CLOTHING AND TEXTILES I — TEST # 350 - 2011**

The performance evaluation **is a required component of the skill certification process**. Each student must be evaluated on the required performance objectives. Performance objectives may be completed and evaluated anytime during the course.

- Students should be aware of their progress throughout the course, so that they can concentrate on the objectives that need improvement.
- Students should be encouraged to repeat the performance objectives until they have performed at a minimum of a number 3 or 4 on the rating scale (**moderately to highly skilled level**).

4 = highly skilled ⇨ Successfully demonstrated without supervision

3 = moderately skilled ⇨ Successfully demonstrated with limited supervision

2 = limited skill ⇨ Demonstrated with close supervision

1 = not skilled ⇨ Demonstration requires direct instruction and supervision

(0 = no exposure)

- When a performance objective has been achieved at a minimum of 80% (moderately to highly skilled level), “**Y**” (**Y=YES**) is recorded on the Summary Score Sheet. If a student **does not** achieve a 3 or 4 (moderately to highly skilled level), then “**N**” (**N=NO**) is recorded on the Summary Score Sheet for that objective.
- All performance objectives **MUST** be completed and evaluated **prior to the objective test**.
- The signed Summary Score Sheet(s) **MUST** be kept in the teachers’ file for one year.

Students who achieve a 3 or a 4 (moderately to highly skilled) on **ALL** performance objectives and 80% on the written test will be issued a CTE skill certificate.

<u><b>OBJECTIVES</b></u>	<u><b>THE REQUIRED PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES ARE:</b></u>
1.01	Identify the parts of the sewing machine.
1.0 and 5.0	Operate and care for the sewing machine.
4.0	Take basic measurements to correctly determine pattern size.
4.0	Demonstrate the correct basic pattern layout, cutting, and pattern marking techniques.
6.0	Construct correct seam allowances with appropriate edge and seam finishes.
5.05	Implement correct pressing techniques throughout project construction.
6.01	Construct an appropriate casing for the project.
6.03	Construct a patch pocket with mitered corners and reinforced top corners (triangle, horizontal, bartack, double row of topstitching).
6.04	Construct a buttonhole.
6.05	Attach a button by using a hand needle and a thread shank.
6.06	Construct a machine-stitched hem.
4.0	Demonstrate the ability to follow directions/guide sheets throughout the project construction.
6.08	Complete one or more of the following hand stitches: blind stitch, hemstitch, slipstitch, whipstitch, or ladder stitch.
