A:

1. Document proficiency in ASL by a SCPI rating of advanced or higher or Level 2 or 3 interpreter certification; (<http://www.aslta.org/certification/index.html>).

**OR**

2. Complete an ASL teacher preparation program at an accredited U.S. university;

**OR**

3. Successfully complete the American Sign Language Teachers Association certification program as qualified or professional;

B: Teacher must document knowledge of the deaf or hearing impaired community either by university course work or by letters attesting to either use of ASL as a primary mode of communication with a family member, as the teacher's "native" language, or by community service; and

C. Teacher must document training in teaching ASL as a World/Foreign Language or a World/Foreign Language methods course.
