
JEFFREY MOORE: Utah December 2023 <u>CTE Teacher of the Month</u>

CTE Teachers in the 21st Century

The Annenberg Institute at Brown University recently published a <u>report</u> that examines the nationally representative data on the CTE teacher workforce from 2004 to 2018. Researchers discovered:

- > CTE teachers are increasingly more prepared and qualified to teach in the field, with aspiring professionals being 16% more likely to be qualified specifically for CTE.
- > CTE teachers (87.3%) had higher year-over-year retention rates in comparison to non-CTE teachers (86.3%).
- ➤ By 2018, CTE teachers became significantly more likely (+10%) to teach in majority-minority schools than their non-CTE counterparts.
