LEA AFFIRMATION OF CONSULTATION WITH PRIVATE NONPROFIT SCHOOL OFFICIALS

The goal of consultation is agreement between the LEA and appropriate PNP school officials on how to provide equitable and effective services for eligible PNP school children under the Equitable Services Provision of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Under ESSA, the Equitable Services Provision applies to Title I Part A; Title I, Part C; Title II, Part A; Title IV, Part A; Title IV, Part B. (ESSA sections 1117 and 8501.)

The "goal of reaching agreement" between an LEA and appropriate PNP school officials is grounded in timely, meaningful, and open communication between the LEA and the PNP school officials on key issues that are relevant to the equitable participation of eligible PNP school students, their teachers and other education personnel, and their families in ESSA programs.

The following topics <u>must</u> be discussed during the ongoing consultation process:

- How the LEA will identify the needs of eligible PNP school children.
- What services the LEA will offer to eligible PNP school children.
- How and when the LEA will make decisions about the delivery of services.
- How, where and by whom the LEA will provide services to eligible PNP school children, including a
 thorough consideration and analysis of the views of the PNP school officials on the provision of
 services through a contract with a third-party provider.
- How the LEA will academically assess the services to eligible PNP school children in accordance with ESSA and how the LEA will use the results of that assessment to improve ESSA services.
- The size and scope of the equitable services that the LEA will provide to eligible PNP school children and, consistent with ESSA, the proportion of funds that will be allocated to provide these services.
- The method or sources of data that the LEA will use under ESSA determine the number of eligible PNP school children from families residing in participating public school attendance areas, including whether the LEA will extrapolate data, if a survey is used.
- The equitable services the LEA will provide to teachers and families of participating PNP school children.
- How the proportion of funds allocated for equitable services is determined (refer to page 3).
- Whether the LEA will provide services directly or through a separate government agency, consortium, entity or third-party contractor.
- If the LEA disagrees with the views of the PNP school officials on the provisions of services through a contractor, the LEA must provide the PNP schools the reasons in writing why the LEA chooses not to use a contractor.
- Whether to provide equitable services to eligible PNP school children by pooling funds or on a school-by-school basis.
- When, including the approximate time of day, services will be provided.
- Whether to consolidate and use funds available for equitable services under each eligible program covered in ESSA to provide services to eligible PNP school children in participating programs.
