USBE School Safety Center Overview

- (2019) The Utah State Legislature passed House Bill (H.B.) 120: Student and School Safety Assessment.
- H.B. 120 formed the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) School Safety Center (SSC).
- The USBE SSC is a group of professionals from USBE, the Utah Department of Public Safety, the Utah Office of Substance Use and Mental Health, and SafeUT at the Huntsman Mental Health Institute.
- The USBE SSC works collaboratively to provide technical assistance, training, and resources that support Local Education Agencies' commitment to ensuring school safety and improving the climate of school communities.

H.B. 61 School Safety Requirements, 2023

- Created the State Security Chief position within the Department of Public Safety.
- Created the School Security Task Force.
- Requires every public primary and secondary school to conduct a threat assessment and designate a school safety specialist.
 \$3.6 MM ongoing for stipends and training.
- Awarded \$75 MM (one-time)
 - Firearm detection software
 - School Safety and Support Grant Program



H.B. 140 Standard Response Protocol to Active Threats in Schools, 2023

- Standard Response Protocols (SRP) ™
 - The I Love U Guys Foundation
 - Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, Shelter
- Define "active threat" and "developmentally appropriate" for emergency response training.

School Safety Specialist Overview

What is a School Safety Specialist: A school employee (e.g. teacher, school counselor, school social worker, school psychologist) who is responsible for supporting school safety initiatives, including threat assessment described in Subsection <u>53G-8-802</u>.

Duties

The School Safety Specialist will be a member of a school's multi-disciplinary team to support school leadership with school safety initiatives by:

- Attending the USBE School Safety Center school safety-related training.
- Participating in threat assessment.
- Ensuring the school has adopted Standard Response Protocol[™].
- Participating in the administration of the School Climate Survey, reviewing the data, and implementing plans to address gaps.
- Updating the school's Emergency Preparedness and Emergency Response Plan in accordance with R277-400-3.
- Communicating with the school community about what the school is doing for school safety.

This position DOES NOT

- Replace the role of a School Resource Officer (SRO).
- Enforce student discipline.

Why

Every public primary and secondary school shall designate a School Safety Specialist in accordance with 53G-8-701.5.

<u>R277-400</u>


- Goal 1: Prevent violence
- Goal 2: Resolve conflict
- Multidisciplinary teaming
- Moving away from zero tolerance; context matters

Keys to behavioral threat assessment:

- Low threshold
- Simple multidisciplinary process
- Fair and equitable resolution

Standard Response Protocol (SRP)™



H.B. 61 (2023) requires every public primary and secondary school to designate a School Safety Specialist.



School Safety Specialist Stipend Grant Approval Process

The Utah Grants Application cannot be approved before the submission in Qualtrics is approved.

- Your LEA should have received an email if there is a missing part of the grant.
- USBE will notify LEAs if allocation funds have been altered.
