3	R277- 631-1. Authority and Purpose.
4	(1) This rule is authorized by:
5	(a) Utah Constitution Article X, Section 3, which vests general control and
6	supervision over public education in the Board;
7	(b) Section 53E-3-401, which allows the Board to make rules to execute the
8	Board's duties and responsibilities; and
9	(c) Section 53G-10-205, which requires the Board to make rules consistent with
10	that Section.
11	(2) The purpose of this rule is to provide standards to public school officials as
12	schools accommodate student and parent requests to refrain from aspects of school
13	due to a student's religious belief or right of conscience.
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15	R277- 631 -2. Definitions.
16	(1) "Aspect of school" does not include provisions related to a school's code of conduct,
17	including school safety and discipline requirements.
18	(2) "Conscience" means a standard based upon learned experiences, a personal
19	philosophy or system of belief, religious teachings or doctrine, an absolute or external sense of
20	right and wrong which is felt on an individual basis, a belief in an external absolute, or any
21	combination of the foregoing.
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23	R277-631-3. Requests to Refrain from Participation in School Activities.
24	(1) A student may refrain from participation in any aspect of school that violates a
25	student's religious belief or right of conscience as described in Section 53G-10-205.
26	(2)(a) If a minor student seeks to refrain from participation as described in Subsection (1),
27	the school shall promptly notify the student's parent about the student's choice.
28	(b) In the event of a conflict, a school shall honor a parent's preference over the
29	preference of the parent's minor student.

30	(3)(a) As described in Subsection 53G-10-205, an LEA may offer an alternative that does
31	not violate the student's or the student's parent's religious belief or right of conscience.
32	(b) A parent or student who refrains from participation under Subsection (1) may suggest
33	an appropriate alternative that requires reasonably equivalent performance by the student of the
34	objective of the curriculum or activity that is believed to be objectionable.
35	(4) In accommodating a student's decision to refrain from participation under Subsection
36	(1), a school may:
37	(a) waive the requirement for the student in the objectionable curriculum or activity if the
38	request does not violate Utah Code or federal law; or
39	(b) accommodate an appropriate alternative as suggested by the parent or student, or
40	other appropriate alternative developed in consultation with the requesting party, that will
41	achieve the academic objectives of the portion of the curriculum, activity, or requirement from
42	which the student is refraining.
43	(5) If a student or parent requests the student refrain from a required course or graduation
44	requirement, the student shall provide other appropriate alternative information or work that has
45	been agreed upon, to demonstrate the student's mastery of the waived content or requirement.
46	(6) A school may not reward or provide credit to a student for work not completed without
47	an appropriate alternative.
48	(7) Permitting the submission of requests for participation waivers, and the provision of
49	reasonable alternatives, is intended to facilitate appropriate protection and accommodation of a
50	requesting party's asserted right of conscience or exercise of religious freedom and may not be
51	an attempt by a school official to incentivize, penalize, endorse, promote or disparage a particular
52	religious or non-religious viewpoint.
