## **Opening Business**

Vice Chair Cindy Davis called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. She read the following statement: As authorized by Utah Code 52-4, this meeting is being held electronically without an anchor location as the location where the public body would normally meet is closed to the public for safety reasons.

#### **Utah Professional Practices Advisory Commission**

The Board convened a taskforce in 2019 to discuss the Utah Professional Practices Advisory Commission (UPPAC) and make recommendations for improvements to UPPAC's process. One of the taskforce's recommendations was that the Board receive training on UPPAC operations and the Board's role in reviewing UPPAC's recommendations.

Ben Rasmussen, the UPPAC Executive Secretary, reviewed how UPPAC works.

Michelle Beus, Assistant Attorney General, educated the Board on the process for Board review of UPPAC recommendations.

#### **Utah Education Funding Study**

In early 2019, the Board engaged with researchers to conduct a comprehensive study of Utah's education funding system. The primary research objective was to determine the extent to which current funding formulas meet their intended purposes and provide equal educational opportunities. The study identified opportunities for improvement and in 2021, the Utah State Legislature expressed interest in addressing those areas by tasking the Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee to study those areas and make recommendations to the Legislature.

Chair Huntsman provided an overview of the Funding Study.

Patrick Lee, USBE School Finance Director, provided a refresher on education finance. Ben Leishman, Finance Manager, Office of the Legislative Fiscal Analyst, answered Board member questions.

Alexander Berg-Jacobson, WestEd, reviewed key findings and recommendations from the study.

Tiffany Stanley, USBE Chief of Staff, Ben Leishman, and Alexander Berg-Jacobson reviewed drivers, insights, and considerations for the way forward on the following: At-risk addon, equalization, economies of scale, coherence of related to basic programs, and effective use of funds.

Board members discussed areas of further analysis or support needed to inform decisions or implementation.

#### Utah ARP ESSER State Application Draft

Board staff is in the process of creating an application for the American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary Schools Emergency Relief (ARP ESSER) as administered by the U.S. Department of Education. The total award value available to Utah K-12 is \$615,526,070.

Sarah Young, Director of Strategic Initiatives, reviewed the timeline for the State Plan and work being done on the draft application that will be before the Board for action in the Board's June 3 meeting.
