Budget Priorities

<u>2023 Legislative Session Funding Priorities</u>

Deputy Superintendent Scott Jones reviewed the Public Education base budget 2023 Legislative Session and the Constitutional Amendment (Article 10). The Public Education Appropriations meetings were completed as of February 7, 2023. The PEA made motions and recommendations for their budget priorities and presented them to the Executive Appropriations Committee (EAC) today, February 9, 2023. Additionally, legislative leadership has provided more information and direction on the constitutional earmark for board review and consideration.
