- Build a student's foundational mathematical knowledge in a systemic way by developing topics intentionally and incrementally.
- Teach clear and concise mathematical language across instructional settings and support students' use <u>of academic specific vocabulary</u> [of the language].
- Understand when and how to use concrete and semi-concrete representations that provide [meaningful]opportunities to understand [math concepts.]
- Know how to correctly use, select, and apply a variety of models <u>and/or</u> representations to facilitate learning [of mathematical concepts and procedures].
- Understand different types of word problems, and instructional strategies that facilitate student problem solving and support the application of mathematical ideas.
- Know how to appropriately implement interventions as part of specially designed instruction that helps students build fluency and automatic retrieval of arithmetic facts. (e.g. games, deliberate practice, timed activities)

- SF06.02 Demonstrate ability to plan, teach, and use effective universal (Tier 1) behavior support strategies in multiple school settings (e.g., classroom, hallways, playground, lunchroom, etc.) to increase the frequency of positive behavior through:
 - o Routines
 - o Procedures
 - o Expectations/rules
 - o Physical arrangement
 - o Consequences
 - o Engagement
 - o **Accountability Practices**

Knowledge of when more intense strategies are necessary based on data and implement interventions with fidelity as necessary (Tiers 2 & 3).

 - o Support positive student behavior and respectful interactions;
 - o Maximize positive student outcomes; and
