R277-113, LEA Fiscal and Auditing Policies (Amendment)

Study Session

Open and Public Meetings Act Training

The Open and Public Meetings Act (OPMA) requires that members of a public body be "provided with annual training on the requirements of [the Open and Public Meetings Act]"

(<u>Section 52-4-104</u>). OPMA's stated goal is to ensure that the state, its agencies, and its political subdivisions deliberate and take action openly (<u>Section 52-4-102</u>).

Assistant Attorneys General Michelle Beus and Ashley Biehl presented the training.

Government Records Access and Management Act (GRAMA) Training

GRAMA Officer Ben Rasmussen presented the annual training to the board members.

The legislative intent is the following:

- Promote the Public's Right of Easy and Reasonable Access to Unrestricted Public Records
- 2. Specify Those Conditions Under which the Public Interest in Allowing Restrictions on Access to Records may Outweigh the Public's interest in access
- 3. Prevent Abuse of Confidentiality by Governmental Entities by Permitting Confidential Treatment of Records only as Provided in GRAMA
- 4. Provide Guidelines for Both Disclosure and Restrictions on Access to Government Records
- 5. Favor Public Access when, in the application of this act, countervailing interests are of equal weight
- 6. Establish Fair and Reasonable Records Management Practices.

ADJOURNMENT
