Board Adopts Budget for the 2026 Fiscal School Year

The Utah State Board of Education approved the <u>2026 State Fiscal Year budget</u>. This budget totals \$6.7 billion and does not include local funding, beginning and closing non-lapsing balances, or Utah Schools for the Deaf and Blind. New programs include, but are not limited to:

- Stipends for Future Educators Grant Program (\$12.4 million one-time)
- Project29, Inspiring Communities through Sport & Education (\$300,000 one-time)
- High School Rodeo Athlete and Ambulance Grants (\$145,000 ongoing)
- Emergency Funding for English Learners (\$5 million one-time)
- Artificial Intelligence (\$4.3 million one-time)

New Administrative Rules, Amendments, and Repeals

The Utah State Board of Education approved, amended, or repealed the following administrative rules:

- R277-497, School Accountability System. This rule is being reviewed after five years and updated to include an oversight category.
- R277-331, Stipends for Future Educators. This rule is being updated to align with HB 204.
- R277-487, Public School Data Confidentiality and Disclosure. This rule is being amended to allow LEAs to set and achieve goals for individual privacy programs.
- R277-113, LEA Fiscal and Auditing Policies. This rule is being updated to maintain reporting components while removing unnecessary language.
- R277-407, School Fees. This rule is being updated as a result of legislative action.
- R277-725, Statewide Online Education Program Contractor Requirements. This
 rule is being repealed after <u>SB 137</u> changed the process for providing online
 services to private school students.
- R277-474, School Instruction and Sex Education (Consent Document). The
 consent form document outlines the parent consent process for sex education
 instruction following the passage of <u>HB 281, Health Curriculum and Procedures</u>
 Amendments.
- R277-474, School Instruction and Sex Education. This rule is being updated to include a consent document following the passage of HB 281, Health Curriculum and Procedures Amendments.
- R277-920, School Improvement and Leadership Development. This rule is being amended to reflect changes in state and federal law relative to school improvement programs.
