Board Makes Statutory Requests

The Utah State Board of Education (USBE) has <u>requested</u> that USBE staff work with legislators to:

- ensure money currently allocated for Title programs continue to serve the students they are intended to.
- create a revenue neutral plan to ensure Utah citizens are not being short changed with federal education dollars being sent to states.
- remove language permitting the use of driver education funds for
 - pupil transportation and
 - other expenditures related to public education as the Legislature designates in 53F-7-201.
- repeal the Early Learning Plan requirements and requirements for the mathematics plan in code.
- amend the WPU funding formula and distribution for students with disabilities in code.

• provide discretion to USBE in distributing the funds associated with 53F-2-310: stipends for special educators for additional days of work.

Board Establishes Legislative Funding Priorities

The Utah State Board of Education discussed <u>funding requests</u> and determined their priorities as:

- 4. K-8 Literacy/Numeracy
- 5. Critical FTE Needs
- Master Pilot Program
- 7. Pupil Transportation
- 8. Early Mathematics Benchmark Assessment
- 9. Adobe Creative Cloud

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Board Approves Use of Fiscal Year 2025 Carry Forward Funds

The Utah State Board of Education (USBE) approved the FY2025 <u>carry forward balance</u> and associated spending plans. Each year, after state fiscal accounts close, some unencumbered funds remain from the previous year. Balances exceeding \$100,000 are reviewed by the USBE Finance Committee along with detailed recommendations for how the funds could best support public education priorities. The Board authorized the use of these carry forward balances. This action allows previously unused funds to be reallocated to high-impact programs and strategic needs impacting Utah's K-12 system.

- \$150,000 to support the Every Day Counts attendance campaign. After the 2025-2026 school year, a report will be presented to the board that includes key data.
- \$1,600,000 to address the Utah Schools for the Deaf and Blind's (USDB) budget deficit.
- \$3,000,000 in repurposed funds to create a contingency fund for USDB. Staff will
 provide an itemized list of expenditures to be reviewed by the Board for each
 \$500,000 that the USDB spends from the \$3,000,000 during the monthly budget
 report.

The Board also approved the use of <u>discretionary carry forward funds</u> for fiscal year 2025. With these funds, the Board will:

- continue a USBE contingency fund of \$200,000 and a legal contingency fund of \$250,000.
- use \$350,000 to:
 - Support the office of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction with \$100,000
 - Continue onsite security guard services at the USBE office with \$150,000

- Establish a building operations budget for fiscal year 2026, covering various replacements and repairs with \$100,000.
- allocate \$38,500 to support a statewide essay contest commemorating the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, for students in grades 5, 8, and high school. The proposed funding breakdown is \$25,000 for 250 awards of \$100 each, \$6,000 for six awards of \$1,000 each, and \$7,500 for three awards of \$2,500 each.

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Board Approves Instructional Time Waiver for Box Elder

School District

The Utah State Board of Education has approved a waiver requested by Box Elder

School District following the tragic loss of two Tremonton police officers killed in the line

of duty earlier this year. In August, the district closed schools for two days so staff and

faculty could attend the officers' funerals and support the local community during a time

of mourning.

State law normally requires a 180-day instructional year, but the Board's action means

the district will not have to make up the two emergency closure days. This waiver

recognizes the extraordinary circumstances faced by Box Elder educators, students,

and families and honors the community's response to the tragedy.
