

NONTRADITIONAL CAREERS LESSON PLAN #2

Exploring Gender Issues in Career Choice Using Online Resources

Objectives:

1. Students will examine how career choice may be influenced by gender.
2. Students will use the internet to investigate gender issues and career choice.
3. Students will access the USOE/CTE website and access the Nontraditional Career Brochures.
4. Students will use critical thinking and writing skills.

Time: 45 – 50 minutes

Grade Level: 9-12

2. Internet Access
3. Handout: Using the Internet to Research Nontraditional Careers

Time in Minutes	Activity
5	<p>Starter Activity.</p> <p>Teacher hands out JOB CHECKLIST. Students work alone or in pairs and complete the checklist of traditional male jobs and traditional female jobs.</p>
10	<p>Discussion.</p> <p>Discussion topics/questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Are there any jobs on the list that a man could not do?• Are there any jobs on the list that a woman could not do?• Why do you think some careers are mostly filled by men?• Why do you think some careers are mostly filled by women?• Does gender affect education and career choice? Should it?
30	<p>Online Activity.</p> <p>Students will log on and access the internet. Each student will use websites indicated and search engines to answer the questions on the handout titled: Using the Internet to Research Nontraditional Careers</p>
5	<p>Lesson Wrap Up.</p> <p>Students should turn in the completed Job Checklist, printed brochure, and the completed internet questions handout.</p>

USING THE INTERNET TO RESEARCH NONTRADITIONAL CAREERS

Find the facts:

There are some misconceptions regarding the workforce in Utah. Using a search engine, type in key phrases such as the ones suggested below, and find the answers to the following questions.

Search phrases: wage gap Utah, Utah divorce rate, Utah gender degree gap

1. What percent of Utah women work outside the home?
2. How does Utah's divorce rate compare to the rest of the nation?
3. For every dollar a man makes in Utah, how much does a woman make?
4. What percentage of men in Utah have earned a bachelor's degree or higher?
5. What percentage of women in Utah have earned a bachelor's degree or higher?
6. What percentage of men 18-24 still live at home? What percentage of young adults 18-35 live at home with their parents? Is this increasing or decreasing? Why?
7. What may be an advantage to choosing a nontraditional career?
8. What may be a roadblock to choosing a nontraditional career?

Investigating Nontraditional Careers:

7. What is the projected growth rate in this profession?
8. List three occupations in this career area.
9. In your opinion, what is the one most interesting fact regarding this career path from the back of the brochure?
10. Where could you find information online about this and other nontraditional or traditional career paths?
