CAMP HIGHLIGHTS

Earth Connections Camp is an outdoor classroom that inspires American Indian youth (2-12) to connect with their natural and cultural heritage, as well as Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) career paths. Students learn about natural resources through sessions on water resource science, units and measurements from 1d to 3d, combined with cultural traditions taught by Tribal and agency experts.

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STUDENTS WILL:

- Learn how American Indian youth can live in two worlds = intertwining western science with traditionalcultural wisdom
- Work with American Indians STEM experts
- Work with American Indian and non-American Indian role models and mentors
- Prepare to be "college career ready"
- Be introduced to educational resources and diversity programs

Sessions will be visual, hands-on, participatory, and engaging.
