

Comparability Overview





Supplement Not Supplant vs Comparability

- While comparability and SNS requirements both examine how the LEA distributes state and local funds/resources to schools, they are separate tests that measure different aspects of the supplemental nature of Title I, Part A funds.
- Comparability's focus is on the services schools receive in the form of instructional FTEs and educational materials and resources.
- While Supplement, Not Supplant (SNS) ensures that Title I schools receive the State and local funds they would have received if they had not been a Title I school.



Supplement Not Supplant vs Comparability

The following scenarios illustrate how an LEA may satisfy one requirement while violating the other:

Example 1: SNS is met, but Comparability is violated

 The LEA is compliant with SNS because it can demonstrate it did not consider school
 Title I status when distributing State and local funds. However, the LEA does not satisfy
 comparability requirements because some Title I schools' student/teacher ratios exceed
 the non-Title I school ratios by more than 10%.

Example 2: Comparability is met, but SNS is violated

The LEA demonstrates comparability through student/teacher ratios. However, the LEA does not satisfy SNS requirements because additional State/local funds are provided to non-Title I schools for technology purchases but not to Title I schools; the LEA expects the latter to finance technology purchases with Title I funds.

Comparability Intent

LEAs must use State and local funds to provide services in Title I schools that, taken as a whole, are at least comparable to the services provided in non-Title I schools.

If all schools in a grade span within the LEA are Title I schools, all schools must be "substantially comparable".

ESEA Section 1118(c)



Comparability Exemptions and Exclusions

- LEAs with only one school; or only one school per grade span.
- Schools with fewer than 100 students.
- Preschool staff and student enrollment

Excluded State and Local Funds

An LEA may exclude State and local funds used for:

- Language instruction for multilingual learners;
- Excess costs of providing services to students with disabilities; and
- Supplemental programs that meet the intent and purpose of Title I.



Requirements: Policy, Procedures, Report

Policy - An LEA must establish, implement, and regularly review:

- an LEA-wide salary schedule;
- a policy to ensure equivalence among:
 - oschools in teachers, administrators, and other staff; and
 - othe provision of curriculum materials and instructional supplies.



Requirements: Policy, Procedures, Report

Written Procedures - An LEA must have written procedures that help implement the policies and provide step-by-step guidance on completing this annual requirement.

Requirements: Policy, Procedures, Report

Report - The LEA must annually complete a Comparability Report to show that all Title I schools are in fact, comparable.

The Comparability Report is uploaded to the <u>Desktop</u> <u>Monitoring Instrument</u> (DMI) annually.



"Skipped" Schools Counted as Title I Schools

- Any "skipped" school (e.g., NESS, secondary school, etc. must be considered a Title I school for comparability purposes).
- When calculating whether Title I schools are comparable, an LEA must treat an otherwise eligible school that was skipped as if it were a Title I school when demonstrating comparability.
- When calculating comparability, the LEA should exclude the supplemental State and local funds expended in the skipped school in its comparability calculations, (e.g., NESS funding).



School Groupings

To demonstrate comparability, an LEA may compare


- All of its schools together, or
- It may group the schools according to grade span.
- The number of grade spans an LEA uses should match the basic organization of the LEA. For example, if the structure of the LEA includes elementary, middle, and high schools, the LEA could compare three grade spans separately.



Group Similar Grade Spans Together

If the organization of the LEA serves similar grades in more than one grouping, e.g., K-3, 4-6, K-6, the LEA should consider the following:

- Include a school in the grade span where the school has the most grade levels in common, or in the grade span that includes the lower grade levels, if the school has the same number of grade levels in common with two or more groups.
- The school may not be placed in a separate grade span to avoid having to compare it to other schools with at least one overlapping grade.




Optional School Size Grouping

- Schools in the same grade span may be grouped further by enrollment size as needed.
- LEAs may identify schools as "larger" and "smaller" in order to demonstrate comparability.
- If one or more schools have half the enrollment of the next larger school in the same grade span, they can be moved into the "smaller" enrollment group to help the LEA demonstrate comparability.
- An LEA may choose to leave all schools in the "larger" grouping as long as it can demonstrate comparability among all the schools in that grade span.

Two Ways To Demonstrate Comparability

1. Student to Staff Ratio

Include teachers and other personnel assigned to schools who **provide direct instructional services** such as classroom, music, art, and physical education Gifted & Talented teachers, and long-term substitutes; counselors; speech therapists; and librarians; as well as other personnel who **provide services that support instruction**, e.g., school social workers and psychologists, etc. If the LEA includes the FTEs of instructional aides/ paraprofessionals, count each full-time aide/paraprofessional paid with State and/or local funds as a 0.5 teacher. Non-instructional aides should not be included.




Two Ways To Demonstrate Comparability

2. Per Pupil Expenditures

Include the total amount of State and local funds allocated to each school for curriculum materials and instructional supplies including technology (i.e., general supplies for instruction, instructional media, textbooks and workbooks, computers, software, and other technology, and library books and media center learning materials).
