Work-Based Learning (WBL) teachers are encouraged to attend the [Western Pathways Conference](#), as there will not be a standalone WBL summer conference this year.

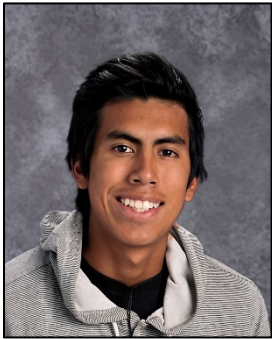
## Maple Mountain Welding Team

## Alex Rodriguez: Future Computer Programmer



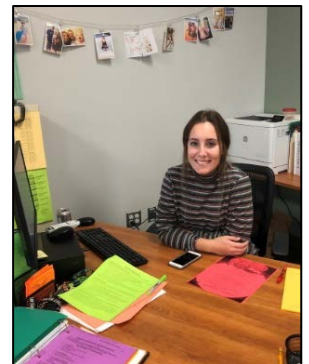
