

**Content Course Eligibility Checklist for CTE/APP License with Adult Education Endorsement Applicants  
(Transcript Review)**

To be eligible to participate in Alternative Route to Licensure CTE/APP License with an Adult Education Endorsement, an applicant's transcript must show 28 semester credits related to the Utah Elementary or Secondary core curriculum. The credits can be spread across the categories. All grades in subject areas considered for evaluation must be a C or higher. Each subject area defined below must have at least one applicable course. *(Course conversion: quarter system - a minimum of 40 credits and a maximum of 60. To convert quarter credits into semester credits, multiply by 66).* Note: with justification, experience in a profession may be considered in lieu of subject area courses.
