Nationally FCCLA = 160,632 members in 5,323 chapters in all 50 states, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Utah FCCLA = 2,944 members in 121 chapters.

Last year, 25 Utah FCCLA chapters participated in the Community Service National program.

TEACHING

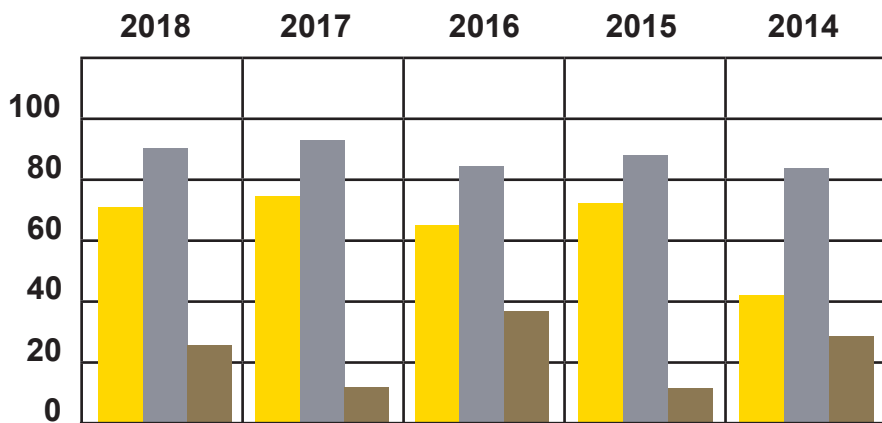
As FCCLA members complete service projects within their school and community, and participate in competitive events they demonstrate their ability to teach members of their families, schools, and communities.
