## GLOSSARY 2020-2021

<b>Advocacy</b>	BTSArts is funded by the legislature. Its sustainability depends on a strong advocacy program led by Friends of BTSArts
<b>Arts Nights</b>	Performances or exhibits scheduled with advocacy as a component
<b>Art Works for Kids</b>	Philanthropic organization beginning in 1995 giving grants to schools, districts, universities and community arts groups for arts education
<b>Arts Integration</b>	Teaching arts standards and other core standards in a lesson or unit in order to provide meaningful learning experiences in every subject area
<b>Arts Educator</b>	The highly qualified teacher specializing in drama, visual art, dance or music
<b>BTSArts</b>	Beverley Taylor Sorenson Arts Learning Program funded by the Utah State Legislature and supported by Friends of BTSArts with the goal of providing meaningful arts integrated instruction for elementary students
<b>Classroom Teacher</b>	The teacher of record in the elementary classroom
<b>Collaboration</b>	Working together for the common good of the students to integrate arts and core standards
<b>Collaborative Teaching</b>	Arts teacher and classroom teacher consulting on integrated lessons with both actively engaged in the lesson
<b>Core Standards</b>	Learning expectations in each subject area
<b>DAC</b>	District Arts Coordinator. Also known as LEA Arts Coordinator

<b>ELA Core</b>	English Language Arts Core Standards (Utah Core Standards)
<b>Endowed Chairs</b>	Seven universities receiving gifts for a professional position to further elementary arts education in Utah’s schools
<b>Friends of BTSArts</b>	Advocacy organization dedicated to the continuation of BTSArts
<b>Informance</b>	Informal sharing and celebration of student learning; may take many forms with audiences comprised of class members, other classes, other grade levels, parent, or others; focus on student learning rather than production
<b>Integrated Arts Instruction</b>	See Arts Integration
<b>LEA</b>	Local educational agencies, i.e. district or charter
<b>LEA Arts Coordinator</b>	Also known as District Arts Coordinator
<b>Lead Coordinator</b>	University personnel given the primary responsibility for implementation of the professional development for BTSALP
<b>PDP</b>	Professional Development Provider working under the direction of the lead coordinator to provide support to individual schools
<b>Performance</b>	A more formal presentation representing student learning
<b>Program Model</b>	BTSArts model consisting of four components: integrated instruction, side-by-side instruction, collaborative planning, and professional development
<b>School Arts Team</b>	Team comprised of administration, teachers, parents and community members with the charge to ensure an arts rich school; should take primary responsibility for advocacy and arts events
<b>School Community</b>	The school extended to all patrons it serves, e.g. business, patrons without children in the system, politicians
<b>Side-by-Side Instruction</b>	Arts teacher and classroom teacher working seamlessly together throughout the delivery of the integrated lesson.
<b>University Partners</b>	Endowed chairs from seven participating universities
<b>USBE</b>	Utah State Board of Education oversees BTSALP under the direction of the state superintendent
