### [Students with Disabilities Preparing for Postsecondary Education: Know Your Rights and Responsibilities](#)

U.S. Department of Education Office for Civil Rights, Sept. 2007. The information in this pamphlet, provided by the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) in the U. S. Department of Education, explains the rights and responsibilities of students with disabilities who are preparing to attend postsecondary schools. This pamphlet also explains the obligations of a postsecondary school to provide academic adjustments, including auxiliary aids and services, to ensure the school does not discriminate on the basis of disability.

Developed by Virginia Commonwealth University. There are sections for teens, parents and school personnel. 3 modules with information, activities, online resources, and videos where students who have disabilities talk about their experiences in college. "My Place": helps students identify his or her learning style, learn about strengths, interests, disability, goal setting, and self advocacy. "Campus Life": learn about faculty expectations, accommodations, grades, technology, and resources. "Planning for College": choosing a college, deciding on a major, applying for college, financial aid, test taking and a 'to-do' list. In addition to the modules, "Going to College" includes a portfolio section that provides students with instructions on how to organize a personal portfolio of information. The portfolio serves as a personal reference tool while visiting colleges and talking with college personnel, such as the individual in charge of accommodations, admissions counselors or career counselors
