CTE Scholarships and Tuition Awards

On Wednesday, April 25, 2018, the annual Career and Technical Education (CTE) Scholarships and Tuition Awards Banquet took place at Salt Lake Community College. This banquet is a longstanding tradition to honor CTE students throughout the state who have been selected to receive a scholarship or tuition award from a postsecondary institution in Utah.

Each award recipient was one of 277 applicants who applied for a CTE Scholarship and Tuition Award. At the banquet, 107 scholarships or tuition awards were awarded to high school CTE seniors for up to one year's tuition at a postsecondary institution.

Read below what 14 CTE Scholarship and Tuition Award recipients say about CTE and their high school experience.

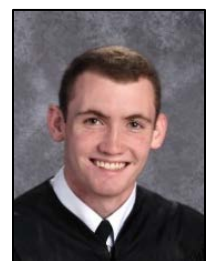


Calissa Robinson: Future Veterinarian

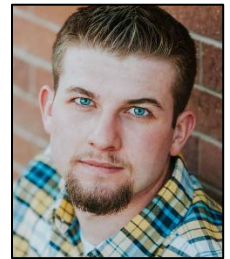


Raegen Knudsen: Future Elementary Education Teacher

Aaron Montoya: Future Computer Programmer

“Getting a degree will help me to pursue my goal of working as a computer programmer at a large company. I want to work at Hill Air Force Base as a computer programmer or at a smaller company like HireVue. CTE classes prepared me by showing me what I would actually be doing in the different job fields and how I would actually apply the information that I learned in class.”



Nate Stagg: Future Welding Engineer

“My occupational goal is to start welding and then move up the ladder to become a welding engineer and/or start and run my own fabrication shop. The CTE courses I took in high school have prepared me for the workforce by showing me how different processes work and how to use them in the proper manner. I received my 390 hour welding certificate through Uintah Basin Technical College. I am currently working on my 600 hour and 990 hour welding certificates.”
