

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE ENDORSEMENT SPECIFICATIONS

This endorsement may be attached to a current Professional or Associate Educator License, qualifies on to teach American Sign Language (ASL) in Elementary or Secondary (grades K-12) ASL classes.

ENDORSEMENT REQUIREMENT AREAS

Only **one demonstration** of competency needed **per requirement area**. **Associate Endorsement Requirements:** Must meet requirement area 1.

- 1. American Sign Language Proficiency
 - <u>American Sign Language Proficiency Interview (ASLPI)</u> Rating: 3+ or higher
 OR
 - Bachelor's degree (or higher) in American Sign Language OR
 - <u>American Sign Language Teachers Association (ASLTA) Certification</u> at Certified or Master level **OR**
 - Utah Interpreter Program (UIP) Certification:
 - Utah Certified Professional Interpreter (UCPI) or
 - Utah Certified Deaf Interpreter (UCDI)

To schedule an <u>American Sign Language Proficiency Interview</u>, please follow the following steps: The Sanderson Center of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing is an approved proctor site for the Gallaudet University American Sign Language Proficiency Interview (ASLPI).

The ASLPI takes place at the Sanderson Center over Videophone (VP) and is evaluated by the ASLPI diagnostic team at Gallaudet University. When registering, select only VP times slots and identify the Sanderson Center as the proctor site. Please direct questions about the ASLPI to the Gallaudet team.
