# USBE Public 2019 Education Summary

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General Session of the Utah Legislature

This publication is written for state school board members, local education agency (LEA) board members, superintendents, charter school administrators, and school business administrators. The main body of the publication reviews each education-related bill that was passed and identifies actions that might be taken by USBE, local school boards, and charter school governing boards to implement the requirements of the legislation. The publication also contains summary information on funding and bills not passed.

This publication is a service of USBE, but is not intended to convey any specific direction or assignments for action by local education agencies. The Utah State Board of Education will adopt administrative rules as necessary to implement new legislation. This publication is also not intended as a formal legal opinion or interpretation of legislative action.

### **Enrollment Growth & WPU**

163,700,000 ongoing & 4,300,000 one-time. This funding includes the WPU value increase. LEAs will be funded on the prior year ADM + growth. Enrollment growth was funded for an estimated increase of 6,750 students next year.



### Voted and Board Local Levy Programs Increase

The Equity Pupil Tax Rate could increase the number of guaranteed local levy increments up to 20 for either the Voted or Board Local Levy Programs with appropriated funds of \$49 million.

**Purpose:** To modernize legacy data systems and enable real-time access to inform decision making at all levels of the education system while also safeguarding against data breaches.

W H A T • Develop an information management system that serves as the mechanism for the Board to collect/report on all student, educator, and financial LEA data.

• The web-based user portal front-end will be accessible by all stakeholders utilizing defined user roles; and will contain data and reporting capabilities, dashboards, and other functional capabilities.

### 2019 Notable Education Bills School Fee Revisions - HB 250

**Purpose:** To ensure fees in the public schools do not create a barrier to full participation to any student, regardless of their financial circumstances.

• Creates standards and requirements for student fee policies, fee schedules, and conditions for charging students fees.

• Clarifies and updates definitions, including updating the definition of "fee" and subparts of that key definition.

• Requires LEAs to provide fee waivers in appropriate circumstances, and to set clear policies and procedures for both waivers and appeals for fee waiver denial.

• Increase parents' awareness of LEA fees and fee policies so that they may make informed decisions.

• Ensure fee waivers are available for students, and that the students and guardians know the waivers and the appeals processes.

• Seeks to remedy previous school fees non-compliance and the Board monitoring of LEA fees.

- Updating rule-making authority for fee provisions, and amends corrective action provisions.
- Requires LEAs to have opportunities for public comments on proposed fee schedules before they are adopted.
- Requires LEAs to post their fee schedules on each of their school's websites.
- Requires a spending plan for each fee.

### **School Fees Task Force**

As a result of an internal USBE and legislative audit, the School Fees Task Force was initiated to ensure that fees do not create a barrier in Utah schools.

The task force crafted a list of recommendations that have been implemented in revisions of R277-407, and have the same goal and the same standards for school fees and fee waivers as HB 250.

### Utah Computer Science Grant Act

Creates a grant program to increase CS offerings in public schools. Requires an applicant to submit a written CS plan to the Board and the Talent Ready Board for approval and report the LEAs usage of grant money.

### HB 416

### Educational Services for Students in Human Services Programs

Requires an educational services plan to include specific information before a human services program submits a plan for licensure under DHS, and defines the terms. HB 391

### Modifications to Governmental Immunity Provisions

Waives an LEAs governmental immunity on injury claims resulting from sexual battery or abuse of a child by a school employee unless the LEA establishes an adequately implemented appropriate behavior policy.
