Check and Connect for Prevention

- Check and Connect is the only **Tier 2** evidence based mentoring program. Utah identifies at-risk students based on their ABC's (Attendance, Behavior, and Course Performance).
- Mentors work with students and families to set-goals to help students re-engage with schools with the goal of graduation.

Absenteeism and Truancy USBE Board Rule(1)

- Absenteeism and Truancy Prevention Board Rule
 <u>R277-</u>
 <u>607</u>
 - Highlights
 - Authority, Purpose, and Oversight
 - Definitions
 - This includes what qualifies as a "Valid" excuse



Absenteeism and Truancy USBE Board Rule(2)

- R277-607-2(8)(viii)- allows LEAs to determine other "Valid" excuses that they will accept
- R277-607-2(8)(b) discusses Parent Acknowledgement
- Promotion of Regular Attendance
 - Includes information about what should be included in your attendance policy and procedures

- Do we have to excuse every absence if a parent calls to excuse it?
- Can we require a doctor's note for medically excused absences?
- How do we decide what our LEA considers a "valid excuse" outside of USBE Board Rule?
